## *Troparion and Kontakion for Sunday, June 4, 2017*

### **The First Antiphon**

The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims His handiwork.  
(Psalms. 18/19:1)

*Refrain:* Through the prayers of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us!  
Day to day pours forth speech, and night to night declares knowledge.  
(Psalms 18/19:2)

*Refrain:* Through the prayers of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us!  
Their proclamation has gone out into all the earth, and their words to the ends of the universe.  
(Psalms 18/19:4)

*Refrain:* Through the prayers of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us!

### **Tone 8            Kontakion**

When He came down and confused the tongues, the Most High divided the nations; but when He distributed the tongues of fire, He called all people to unity.//Therefore, with one voice we glorify the most-Holy Spirit.



### ***Epistle: Acts 2:1-11***

**2** When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. **2** And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. **3** Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and *one* sat upon each of them. **4** And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. **5** And there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men, from every nation under heaven. **6** And when this sound occurred, the multitude came together, and were confused, because everyone heard them speak in his own language. **7** Then they were all amazed and marveled, saying to one another, "Look, are not all these who speak Galileans?" **8** And how *is it that* we hear, each in our own language in which we were born? **9** Parthians and Medes and Elamites, those dwelling in Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, **10** Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya adjoining Cyrene, visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, **11** Cretans and Arabs – we hear them speaking in our own tongues the wonderful works of God.

### ***Gospel: John 7:37-52, 8:12***

**7** On the last day, that great *day* of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. **38** He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." **39** But this He spoke concerning the Spirit, whom those believing in Him would receive; for the Holy Spirit was not yet *given*, because

Jesus was not yet glorified. <sup>40</sup> Therefore many from the crowd, when they heard this saying, said, "Truly this is the Prophet." <sup>41</sup> Others said, "This is the Christ." But some said, "Will the Christ come out of Galilee?" <sup>42</sup> Has not the Scripture said that the Christ comes from the seed of David and from the town of Bethlehem, where David was?" <sup>43</sup> So there was a division among the people because of Him. <sup>44</sup> Now some of them wanted to take Him, but no one laid hands on Him. <sup>45</sup> Then the officers came to the chief priests and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why have you not brought Him?" <sup>46</sup> The officers answered, "No man ever spoke like this Man!" <sup>47</sup> Then the Pharisees answered them, "Are you also deceived? <sup>48</sup> Have any of the rulers or the Pharisees believed in Him? <sup>49</sup> But this crowd that does not know the law is accursed." <sup>50</sup> Nicodemus (he who came to Jesus by night being one of them) said to them, <sup>51</sup> "Does our law judge a man before it hears him and knows what he is doing?" <sup>52</sup> They answered and said to him, "Are you also from Galilee? Search and look, for no prophet has arisen out of Galilee." **8** Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, "I am the Light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the Light of Life.
