AUGUST 2023 NEWSLETTER AND CALENDAR



The month of August brings an end to the Church's yearly liturgical cycle with two Great Feasts: the Transfiguration of our Lord upon Mount Tabor, and the Dormition of the most holy Theotokos. Prior to the feast of the Dormition on August 15th, we enter together into a fasting period for two weeks. With Great Lent, the Dormition Fast is one of the two stricter fasting seasons of the year. We abstain from all animal products, cut back on our entertainment, and add to our charitable works and to our prayers for two weeks as we prepare to celebrate the feast of the Dormition—the time when the most holy Mother of God becomes our Heavenly Mother and Intercessor before the Lord.

The feast of the Transfiguration falls during the Dormition fast on August 6th. We mystically return to the time when Christ revealed His glory to his select disciples upon Mount Tabor, demonstrating that He is the Eternal God whom Moses and Elijah worshipped.

It is a paradoxical time of year. While we sense that we ought to be mournful on a feast that commemorates Our Lady's death, we rejoice that she is in heaven, glorified in her body, becoming the very first human being to experience the final resurrection. Likewise, while we should be exulting in the joy of the Transfiguration, it still falls within the

Dormition Fast. We observe the feast by only lightening our fast a little, making it a "fasting feast."

This paradox allows us to experience what the Fathers call "Joyful Sorrow." It is an essential balance that helps the Christian to continue in the spiritual life. We experience sorrow, but we do not despair because we know that our Lord has conquered death and that He remains with us until the end. We encounter joy, but we do not get carried away into frenzy or debauchery because we are keenly aware of our continual need for repentance.

Joyful Sorrow helps us to keep our eyes upon the Lord. The enemy is the great "swinger of the pendulum." He wants to tempt us into the extremes of elation or despair because these extremities require all of our attention. They turn our attention away from Christ and toward our own situation. Maintaining Joyful Sorrow, though, keeps our gaze upon Christ.

The Church in Her wisdom grants us this month in which to live out and experience Joyful Sorrow through the rhythm of our liturgical life. As we enter the Dormition fast, then, let us pray to the most holy Theotokos that she would help us to keep our eyes gazed upon her Son, our God—the Transfigured Lord! In this way we will end the liturgical year well, maintaining the Joyful Sorrow, the hopeful balance that the Church offers to us for our salvation.

Paraklesis Service

On the two Wednesdays of the Dormition Fast we will serve the Paraklesis, also known as the Small Supplicatory Canon to the Theotokos. It's a beautiful and traditional way to seek the intercessions of the Mother of God for any need.
